## 'Managing water resources will be key to agri future'

Anaging water resources will be key to future of agriculture in the country, said MLA Pankaj Bhoyar at the inaugural session of four-day workshop on 'Agroentrepreneurship and water resource management', reports



Balwant Dhage from Wardha. The workshop was organized by Bajaj Foundation and Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, Delhi at Yatri Niwas of Sewagram Ashram on Saturday. More than hundred activists from 17 states participated in the workshop. Mahendra Fate, Wardha coordinator of Bajaj Foundation, said, "In the four-day training we have two-day theoretical programmes while two days are devoted for field visit, which will be regarding the work done on water harvesting, river widening by the foundation. The group will visit the farms of ideal farmers." An expert in water resource management Madhav Kotasthane said, "80% of India's areas are dry and do not get the benefit of any irrigation projects and river water, so they face both floods and droughts every year. Even 80% villages are on river bank or any other source of water still they face water scarcity. To tackle the issue, we need an effective, scientific approach like the Tamaswada Project where since 2010, no water scarcity has been felt."
